Safe Food Handling

All programs must have at least one person at your facility that is Safe Food Handling certified. We hold monthly online classes through UNH Cooperative Extension so that you can easily access this certification class. The online session is about 90 minutes long and covers safe food handling, food storage, food preparation, cleanliness and so much more. Agency Year End Summaries

Later this month you will receive a letter in the mail listing your total pounds received from the NH Food Bank for 2020. We hope to provide this information to you annually from here on out so that you can be aware of your Food Bank activity as well as having this information for your own records.

Per Feeding America guidelines, all programs are required to acquire a minimum of 3,000 pounds of food from the NH Food Bank per calendar year. Currently though, we are not enforcing this rule for 2020 due to the many changes and closures of programs due to COVID-19. This requirement will be enforced at a later date once things are "back to normal".

Mobile Food Pantries

With much thanks to the Federal CARES Act and COVID Relief funding, the NH Food Bank was able to hold 70 Mobile Food Pantries across all 10 counties in the state. 1.9 million pounds of food was distributed to over 24,000 households. We would like to extend a sincere thank you to all of the programs that helped spread the word about these events and also took the time to volunteer at these events. We would not be able to make these distributions happen without your help, time and care. Together, we are all working to make a difference during this pandemic and provide for as many people as possible, but we can't do it without your help. Thank you to all of our amazing programs and volunteers!

This holiday season several NH Food Bank agencies (located in western and central NH) received a generous donation of live Christmas Trees that were then distributed to their clients. The 140 Christmas trees were provided by the NH Hoby Alumni Association and the Putnam family tree farm with deliveries made by New England Document Systems.

Live Christmas trees can sometimes cost \$50-\$100 each and many families were excited to receive one of these free trees this year. We are hopeful that his generous donation and distribution will become a new partnership with more families benefitting from this gift in 2021.
