## Emergency Snow Closures



The NH Food Bank makes every effort to remain open during snow storms unless it is unsafe to do so. If the decision is made that we will be closing the next day and your program has a scheduled appointment that day, we will call you ahead of time to re-schedule your appointment or delivery. If the NHFB does close unexpectedly due to receiving more snow than expected, please check the chyron displayed at the bottom of the screen on WMUR (listed as NH Food Bank).

## Thermometers

Per Feeding America and food safety protocol, all refrigerators and freezers at your facility are required to have thermometers actively in use to ensure your appliances are functioning at food safe temperatures. The proper temperature for refrigerators should be between 32-41° F, and proper temperature for freezers should be at or below 0° F. Weekly temperature checks of your equipment should be recorded on any type of log of your choosing. These logs will be reviewed at your annual monitoring visits.

If your program is in need of thermometers, please contact your NHFB coordinator and we will have some added to your next order.
