Meal Connect Deadline

Agencies that are partnered with a local store as part of our Fresh Rescue program will need to use the new Meal Connect website by January 1st, 2022 (unless an agreement has been previously made with our team). At this time, about 50% of partnering agencies are using this online reporting system, but we encourage your program to learn more about this reporting website before it does become required. For now, we have been allowing agencies the option of continuing to use paper reporting, but will require this switch over by end of year. Reporting using this website can be done on any computer, tablet or even your smart phone.

Agencies are able to report each pickup that is done individually or as a weekly total. This allows you to submit your received donations in real time and not have to worry about passing in a paper report at the end of the month.

Users have found this website option to be easy to use and also a time saver. Training is just 2 short videos that you can watch when it is best for you. Please reach out to Jocelyn or Kristie for more information about how to use the website and become enrolled for logging in.

Dietary Options For Clients

We have received inquiries about what food items are diabetic friendly or that support a healthy diet. As items available on Agency Express do change periodically, we work to ensure that there is a variety for you to choose from each time you place an order.

A diabetic friendly diet is one that contains fresh, frozen and canned fruits and vegetables with minimal added sugar or sodium, as well as whole grains, lean proteins, and healthy fats. Whole grains are less processed forms of grains and contain more fiber which helps to slow blood sugar.

Items found on Agency Express labeled as "Foods to Choose Often" are going to be mostly diabetic friendly. These options have limited added sugar, sodium, and saturated fat. Examples that are regularly available are canned and frozen fruits and vegetables, black beans or other varieties of beans, canned chicken and fish, low sodium spaghetti sauce, whole grain pasta, brown rice, and oats. Items that are marked on the manufacturers label as "low sodium" will be noted on the product descriptions on Agency Express.

Several agencies were excited to receive their Albertson's and/or C&S deliveries for their clients.



During the month of August, several NHFB food pantries and children's programs around the state received breakfast and lunch food items as part of grants from Albertson's Companies Inc., and C&S Wholesale Grocers.

Thirty-six NH Food Bank programs received prepacked boxes of breakfast items as well as assorted cereals, shelfstable milk and juice items as part of the Albertson's grant.

Eligibility for recipients of these two grants was based on their location and program type.
